**YouTube Has Banned Dangerous Pranks<sup>1</sup> and Challenges**

1 This week [January 2019], YouTube decided to ban “dangerous challenges and pranks” from the platform [...] with a promise they will remove content that qualifies as encouraging “violence or dangerous activities”.

One reason for that decision is the growing popularity of the dangerous “Bird Box challenge” which was inspired by the Netflix horror film “The Bird Box” starring Sandra Bullock. The challenge went viral and made waves all over the media when people started to move around blindfolded. At least one car accident has been linked to the challenge. In the movie, Sandra Bullock has to keep herself blindfolded to avoid a terrible fate. So, she has to move around without being able to see anything. That scenario seemed to be very fascinating for the YouTube community.

5 “YouTube is home to many beloved viral challenges and pranks, but we need to make sure what’s funny doesn’t cross the line into also being harmful or dangerous,” they explained in the revised guidelines posted online. “We’ve updated our external guidelines to make it clear that we prohibit challenges presenting a risk of serious danger or death, and pranks that make victims believe they’re in serious physical danger, or cause children to experience severe<sup>2</sup> emotional distress<sup>3</sup>.” [...]

10 Viral challenges are popular on YouTube and social media, from the ice bucket challenge — which helped raise money for research on ALS — to the “mannequin” and “In My Feelings” challenges, which inspired people to upload creative dance videos. But it looks like people have finally taken things too far with the *Bird Box* challenge, and YouTube is making an official  
15 step towards encouraging a safer environment.
